



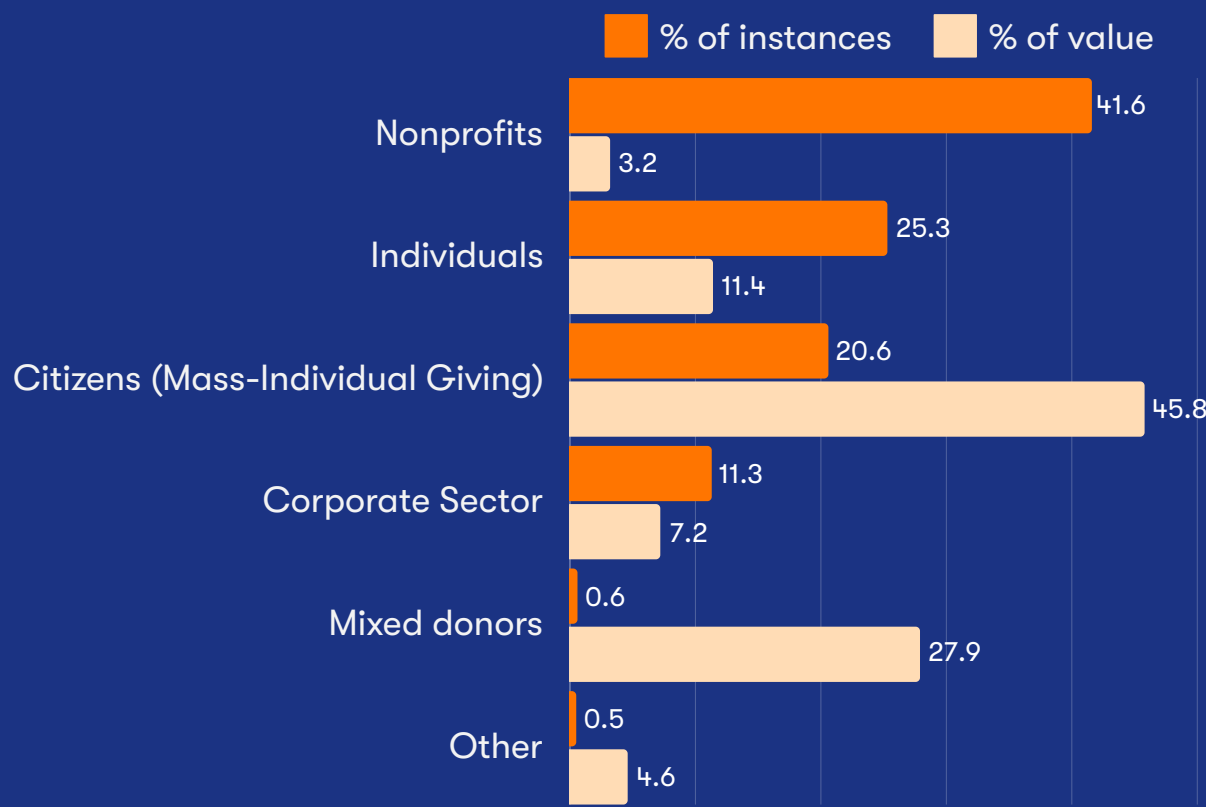

GIVING BY THE NONPROFIT SECTOR

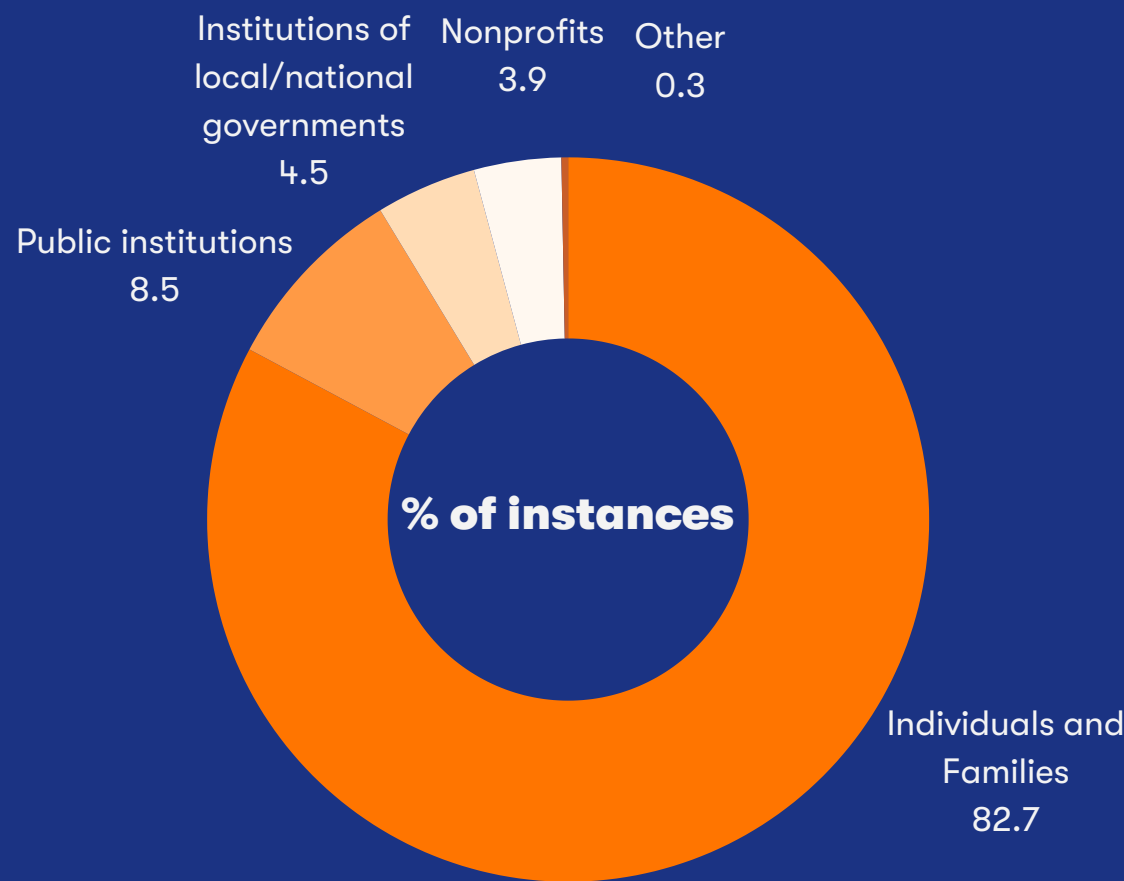
In 2023, Kosovar philanthropy was characterized by a significant change in the composition of its donor structure. Donations from the nonprofit sector represented a remarkable 41.6% of all giving instances, with CSOs and private foundations as the most frequent type of donor in Kosovo for the first time.

This evolving landscape indicates a potential shift towards more organized and strategic philanthropy, promoting collaboration between non profit organizations and other sectors for a coordinated response to social and humanitarian needs.



In 2023, CSOs and private foundations in Kosovo predominantly supported initiatives addressing poverty relief through assistance for individuals through short-term aid efforts.
